If so what is available?</i>	MindGenius is available on the Conservatoire's IT network and ZoomText can be linked to students' individual log-in IDs by arrangement with IT Support. Learning Support computers have access to TextHelp Read and Write Gold.
<i>Are any assistive technology resources available made available to the for students with disabilities/SpLDs? If so what is available?</i>	Students may access Learning Support for specific disability study skills support.
<i>Does University accommodation have internet access? Do students have to pay? Please tell us about campus wifi coverage.</i>	The Conservatoire has no accommodation of its own, but student halls of residence in the area usually have internet access. Free Wi-Fi access is available in the Conservatoire to all enrolled students accessing the network.
<i>Does the library make any accommodations for students with disabilities/SpLDs?</i>	The library offers wheelchair access, a book collection service, fetch and carry service, photocopiers and printers with a

	<p>range of coloured paper stocks, e-books (where available), longer loans on some library books and printed music, large print book and music ordering service, and library guides and information in alternative formats, upon request. Shelves and books are clearly labelled in size 22 font. Students can borrow book chairs and coloured overlays for use in the library.</p>
<p><i>Do you have study areas on campus specifically for the use of students with disabilities/SpLDs? Is specialist AT available in these areas? Please list.</i></p>	<p>The Conservatoire has a small, heavily used one-building campus with no specific study areas for disabled students or those with SpLDs. Study rooms in the library are, however, available and Learning Support has a dedicated room within the Conservatoire with access to some AT (see above).</p>
<p><i>Are examination script labels used for students with disabilities to identify the scripts to markers? Please give as much detail as possible. Please make distinctions between coursework and examinations where appropriate.</i></p>	<p>The Conservatoire has in place an Access Arrangements policy which covers disability access arrangements for all assessments. There are no written timed examinations on any of our courses but extensions to assignment deadlines can be arranged and arrangements made for in-house timed tests.</p>
<p><i>What arrangements are in place for students in receipt of extended testing time?</i></p>	<p>See above.</p>
<p><i>Does the HEI cover costs for support workers in examinations ie for readers and scribes...or is the DSA used to cover these?</i></p>	<p>Not usually required because there are no timed examinations on any of our courses, but DSA would be used if required.</p>
<p><i>Do any other 'student services' have particular provisions for students with disabilities? For example is there a dedicated careers adviser, study abroad adviser, residential services/accommodation adviser, study skills adviser?</i></p>	<p>No specific provision – the disability coordinator and advisor liaise with other support services such as accommodation, welfare and careers on the student's behalf.</p>

<i>Any other specialist provisions?</i>	Leeds College Of Music is a specialist music Conservatoire and runs all of its courses on an Apple Mac platform. The Conservatoire is an Apple Accredited Training Centre for the Apple Mac recording and arranging software Logic Pro X. We offer specialist tuition on this software. Extra tuition in music theory is also available specifically for students with learning difficulties within this.

Notetakers will be familiar with subject-specific vocabulary and technical language. £25 per hour (no VAT)</p>

<i>Support Role</i> <i>Charge Rate ex VAT</i> <i>Charge Rate inc VAT</i>	Practical Support Assistant (Band 1) Providing practical support such as carrying and setting up music equipment, guiding around facilities, reading information on plasma screens.

<i>Support Role</i> <i>Charge Rate ex VAT</i> <i>Charge Rate inc VAT</i>	Library Support Assistant (Band 1) Assistance with accessing library facilities and services including fetching and carrying books, carrying out photocopying, locating items in the library, working one to one with a specific student in addition to the services offered to all students by library staff.

Leeds College Of Music is a small specialist music Conservatoire with a higher than average proportion of students with disabilities and learning difficulties and high uptake of DSA. Course information sheets are available for each HE course to give more information on the specialist nature of the courses, including specialist software and equipment used and the methods of delivery and assessment of each course. However, we recommend that Assessors contact the Disability Advice Coordinator or Disability Advisor for more information before finalising the study needs report. These information sheets are updated periodically.
